

Action Plan from the State of Michigan

Region 5 Adult Immunization Conference on 6/11/2018

Goal: *Enhance the adult immunization neighborhood through partnership and promotion of immunization best practices – reaching adults where they live, learn, work, and gather.*

- 1. Promote improved access to adult vaccinations through pharmacies.**
 - a. Communicate with the Michigan Pharmacist Association (MPA) about membership pharmacists comprehensive medication review (CMR) and including adult immunizations (and utilizing the MCIR) in CMRs.
 - b. Continue to collaborate with MPA on identified barriers and opportunities for community immunizers.
 - c. Develop and distribute the Fourth Edition of the MDHHS Pharmacy White Paper.
- 2. Promote improved access to adult vaccinations through workplace wellness programs.**
 - a. Identify professional membership organizations, worksite wellness contractors, or other stakeholders in occupational health.
 - i. Encourage private and public entities to offer employees vaccine education and/or vaccines through the workplace.
 - ii. Communicate best practices, including the offer of low- or no-cost vaccines at the worksite with convenient access times.
 - b. Continue to provide immunization education opportunities to occupational medicine providers.
- 3. Promote improved access to adult vaccinations through campus health centers.**
 - a. Continue to collaborate with the Alana's Foundation on the College Flu Challenge (CFC).
 - i. Many schools already collaborate with campus student organizations, suggest a stronger emphasis on student group involvement.
 - ii. Suggest addition of a co-administration field to self-survey.
 - As the CFC is open to everyone this could promote adult vaccination across the lifespan.
 - iii. Suggest additional award category for campus initiatives that promote other needed adult vaccines to protect health, such as HPV, HepA, HepB, Tdap, or Meningococcal vaccines.
